Electronic Monitor Program Information & Application

The Washburn County Sheriff's Office operates an Electronic Monitoring Program as an alternative to confinement within the jail facility, providing a cost effective, structured and monitored environment. Our office utilizes GPS and alcohol sensing technology as a tool to assist with monitoring the movements and compliance of inmates enrolled in the Program. This technology combined with home visits allows officers to more closely monitor inmate movement while increasing the level of community safety.

The Electronic Monitoring Program was designed for offenders who pose a minimal risk to the community. The program can be used for offenders who have special needs or problems that may be better managed in their home environment.

Electronic Monitoring Program may be used as a tool to manage inmate population, monitor Huber release inmates and/or manage special needs inmates where incarceration inside the facility is undesirable.

Requirements:

1. Permanent residence approved by Huber Officers. All other adult residents must agree to your participation.
2. Have a cellular phone that includes talk, text and a data plan.
3. Current with all Huber fees.
4. Have \$300 available at date of set up to cover the first 15 days of monitoring. Accounts must have a positive balance at all times. Fees are \$20 per day. For sentences of 15 days or less you will be required to pay the total amount of monitoring fees prior to set-up.
5. Submit to random Urine Analysis and Preliminary Breath Test.
6. Follow all city, county, state, federal laws and ordinances throughout your supervision.
7. If ordered to install an Ignition Interlock Device (IID) upon conviction you must have proof of installation prior to set-up.
8. Success/failure in other court programs (current and past cases) will be strongly factored into decision. These programs include pre-trial program, community service, Drug Court, etc.

Disqualifiers:

1. Serving violent felony conviction
2. Serving child support sentence
3. Serving felony drug conviction
4. Serving sex offense conviction
5. Placement on SORP registry
6. Felony domestic violence conviction (current or past)
7. Multiple felony OWI convictions
8. Offense resulting in serious injury or death

Your history is extremely important in determining if you will be considered for this program. Electronic monitoring is a privilege. You are not considered eligible for this program until a completed background and application review determines you meet the criteria. You will need to be sentenced to be considered for the Electronic Monitoring program. Requirements and disqualifiers can be waived at the discretion of the Sheriff or their designee.

10. Must send 24 in our jail before being put on Monitor
